Becky will be exhibiting approximately 20 of her newest acrylic and oil paintings. Becky grew up on the south side of Indianapolis and attended Indianapolis Public School No 31, No 22. She majored in art at Wood High School, and attended Herron School of Art. She taught adult watercolor classes at the Shelby Art Association and the Blue River Artist Gallery in Shelbyville. Becky also enjoys leading wine & canvas events and working with children to create both paintings and crafts.

Her professional journey began approximately 15 years ago, which she describes as a calling from the Creator to start using the talent he gave to her in a more dedicated manner. She states that although she painted somewhat regularly, she was always hesitant to call herself an artist. I simply paint what I love to see and what I love to think about. I love the curves and deep inner parts of flowers, the complexity of birds and other living things, the texture of stone, a glassy surface of the ocean on a calm day, massive angry clouds, fog, colors mashed upon one another, reflections of a palm tree on water....the list is long.

Becky has won awards in the Brown County Art Gallery Student Show, SALI Members show for Best of Show and People's Choice award in 2024. Her landscape of the Lilly Home orchard at Newfields (formerly the Indianapolis Museum of Art) was featured in the popular HGTV show, "Good Bones". The City of Shelbyville commissioned a painting of the town square to be gifted to their "sister city" in Shizuoka, Japan, home of famous Mount Fuji. It hangs in the mayor's office in Shizuoka.

Becky paints a variety of subjects but enjoys the challenge of portraiture. Her recent painting of two grandsons on a sailboat "Cousins", won Best of Show this past summer at the SALI member show, and she is regularly commissioned to paint portraits.
